80. MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 19TH JANUARY 2015

82. COMMUNITY SAFETY MATTERS

There's been a dramatic reduction in anti social behaviour about the town with 3 youths being arrested.

Fab Friday initiative is working well with youths who previously were causing problems now attending the schemes set up.

As a result of giving them something to do there's a lot less problems around the town. Funding for the Youth Service was requested specifically for the purchase of board games. A sum of between £50 and £100 is required. It was suggested an application be made to the Town Council.

Members raised the following issues:

- a. Vandalism to cars on Bryncenydd Estate.
- b. Empty unit on Pontygwindy Estate may cause problems in future.
- c. Parking behind Pontygwindy Road rear Rugby Club causing problems at home matches. The Head Teacher at the Welsh School has agreed to open the school for parking but stewards will be needed and the club must come on board.
- d. Body worn cameras are still being tested and are thought to be useful in the prevention of crime.
- e. Off road motorcycles and quad bikes causing a problem around town.

85. PROJECTS AND TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

a. Town Council Events 2015

The Town Clerk presented the report informing members of the dates of the Town Council Events in 2015.

He explained the problems of booking venues for the dates required although this had now been resolved with the help of Tony Payne at Caerphilly Castle.

Members accepted the report and agreed to the quotations provided by the clerk from the contractors who provide the PA System and Fireworks in previous years. The Fireworks Company, Pendragon, will be paid in two instalments as usual.

b. One Voice Wales

The clerk informed members that subscription to One Voice Wales for 2015 would be £943.50 and would then increase to £1,887 for subsequent years.

Members decided not to take up the offer to join One Voice Wales this year.

c. <u>Concessionary Use of Caerphilly Castle</u>

The clerk tabled a letter from the District Commissioner of the Caerphilly, Rhymney and Islwyn Scout District requesting a concessionary use of Caerphilly Castle and for the Town Council to meet the hire charge.

Members debated the request and decided to grant the concession and pay the hire fee.

86. PLANNING MATTERS

Councillor Fussell declared an interest and took no part in the discussions or decision making.

The Town Clerk took members through the planning applications:

Members agreed to write to the Planning Department expressing their concerns over the lack of parking provisions on these two applications and the problems this will cause to local residents.
