70. MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 17TH NOVEMBER 2014

Minutes of the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday 17th November 2014 were received, confirmed and signed.

71. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

No matters arising.

72. COMMUNITY SAFETY MATTERS

Small increase in anti social behaviour particularly around the town. Dispersal notices came into force in December and these seem to have moved youths from the town.

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Two initiatives to help reduce anti social behaviour have been introduced with the help of funding from the Borough. An initiative with Cardiff City F.C. takes place on a Thursday at Virginia Park. The second initiative called Fab Fridays has started and the two seem to be helping reduce anti social behaviour.

Inspector Gareth Jones updated members on changes to police work from April. A new operating module will be introduced and Gwent police will be divided into East and Western areas. Caerphilly and Bedwas will be grouped together under Inspector Jones. There will be a team of neighbourhood police officers working out of Bedwas, starting 2nd February.

PACT brand is going and a new initiative called Your Voice will replace it.

- b. Incident rear Bartlett Street.
- c. Parking at school times outside Ysgol Gynradd Cymraeg y Castell on junction of Heol Trecastell/Crescent Road causing serious problems (times 8 am to 9 am, 12 pm to 1 pm and 3 pm to 4 pm) despite there being a free car park for a 20 minute period. Police were asked to attend and either issue tickets or warnings to people who park illegally.

Menter laith Sir Caerffili - Application for Funding to support its summer festival, Ffiliffest

Menter laith Sir Caerffili is a voluntary, community based organisation and a registered charity. Its principal aim is to increase the opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds to use the Welsh language within their local communities. In order to achieve this aim we develop new and innovative community projects which stimulate and encourage community development and participation in addition to enabling communities to lead their own projects. Menter laith are now active in several fields including youth work, childcare, community training and volunteering opportunities, Welsh for adults and partnerships with the private sector. These projects enable people to use the Welsh language on a community level in a variety of ways. Previously, Welsh speakers and learners, both adults and children, were faced with a severe lack of services and opportunities to use the Welsh language outside education. During the past fourteen years, Menter laith has responded to this lack of equal opportunity by developing and providing projects which now enable people to use the Welsh language within their own communities. These projects work with young children within our childcare and play schemes, young people through youth clubs and youth activities, adult Welsh learners through learners' groups and local businesses through our advice and support. A key element of our work is the development of new and stimulating Welsh medium work opportunities, placements, training opportunities and volunteering opportunities for local people.

All of our projects have developed through partnerships with other organisations such as schools and nurseries, GAVO, Caerphilly C.B. Council, Gwent Centre for Welsh for Adults, local businesses, voluntary organisations, Communities First Partnerships and various other organisations. We work with communities throughout Caerphilly County Borough and engage with over 3500 Welsh speakers and learners at present in addition to 20+ organisations and societies. Menter laith Sir Caerffili has a Management Committee of 12 members and all projects are open to volunteers. We currently work with approximately 20+ volunteers across our projects. Menter laith is a registered charity.

Ffiliffest is our annual summer festival which provides an opportunity for children, young people and their families to take part in a range of opportunities including dance, crafts, music workshops, sports workshops, writing sessions and enjoy performances from a number of local groups, schools and artists. There is also a large number of craft and food stalls within the Great Hall and within the outside areas. The main feature of the day is a huge display of folk dancing by 20 local primary schools, both English and Welsh medium. The event provides an opportunity for communities from across the area to celebrate their local cultural heritage while also taking part in a huge range of activities. Ffiliffest is the only local festival which currently celebrates the Welsh language and local heritage. In June 2015 we will once again be working in close partnership with CADW and holding the festival within the grounds of Caerphilly Castle. During the event in 2014, approximately 1300 people attended the event and questionnaires completed by those attending were extremely positive. Menter laith Caerffili is eager to continue to improve the festival and also to ensure that the event is accessible to as many local families as possible.

As an organisation we have considered the feedback recorded during last year's event and we are keen to address a number of key issues:

- Many noted they would like to see more activities for children, particularly arts and crafts activities
- A number of young people noted they would like to see a larger performing stage with a more varied programme of performers
- The majority of families wished to see it as a free entry event. Tickets had to be purchased from CADW at the entrance in order to attend the event during previous events. Many people noted that the majority of community events are usually free and that more families would be able to attend if there wasn't a charge.

Menter Caerffili have recently held a number of discussions with CADW in order to ensure that the event is a free event, and therefore accessible to as many families as possible, in particular those from nearby disadvantaged and deprived. CADW have agreed to hire the castle to Menter Caerffili for a fee of £2500 which enables us to set up the event during the previous day, hold the event on the day of the festival and consider the possibility of extending the activities to other areas of the castle. We feel that this is a crucial development in terms of attracting more families and ensuring that the event is accessible to more local people.

In terms of improving the activities provided we wish to increase the number of arts and cultural activities available to children and young people. We are therefore seeking funding to provide an arts and crafts marquee within which families would have the opportunity to try pottery, graffiti art, badge making and a number of other craft activities. Similarly we would like to arrange a larger performing stage which would enable local performers to have the opportunity to perform in addition to some of Wales' leading groups and soloists. The funding we are applying for is noted below, followed by funding already secured from other sources:
