

# 76. MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 16<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2017

Minutes of the Ordinary Council Meeting held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> January 2017 were received, confirmed and signed.

#### 77. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

The Town Mayor Councillor S. Kent confirmed cheques for the Open Art Competition were made payable to the prize winners. He went on to explain there was an additional prize of £50 selected by members of the public. This brought the total prize money to £1,050. Members agreed to the additional £50 on top of the £1,000 agreed at the January meeting.

a. Caroline Hales introduced Richard Tovey to members Richard is the ward manager for Caerphilly.

Caroline provided members with statistics comparing crime and anti-social behaviour figures for February 2016 to February 2017 for both St. Martins and Morgan Jones Wards.

The anti-social behaviour figures for Morgan Jones Ward are caused by boy racers in Asdas car park. A request for barriers has been passed to head office and it is hoped barriers stopping cars entering the car park when the store is closed will stop this ASB.
